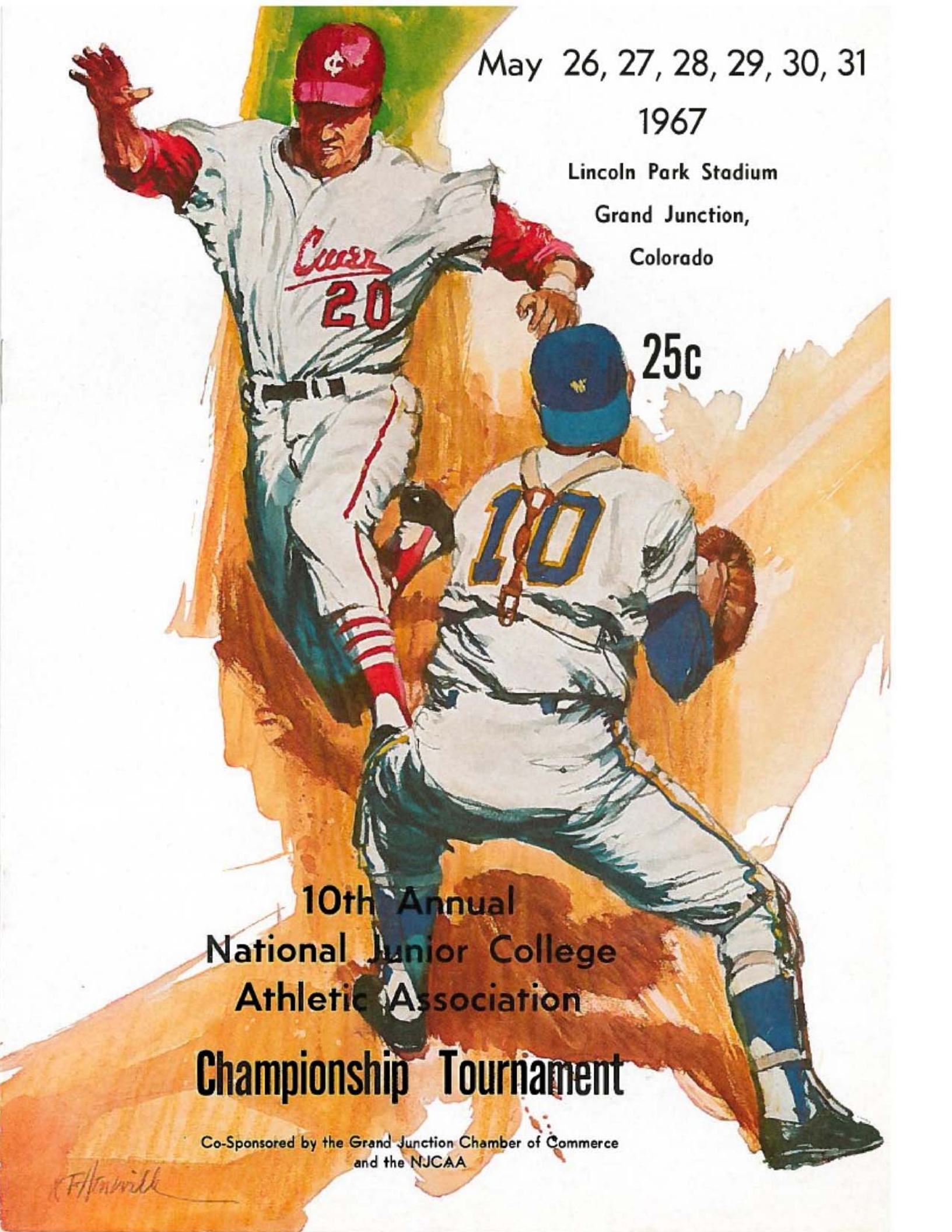

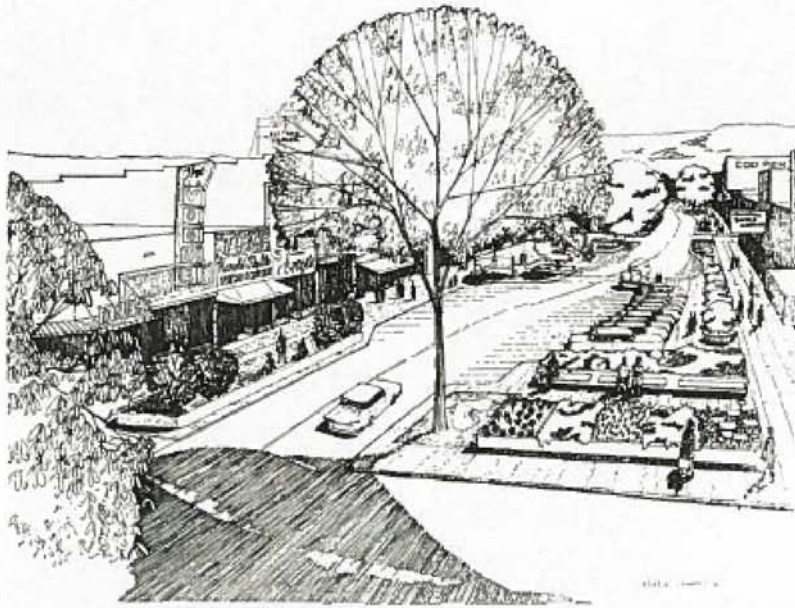

Grand Junction, Colorado

Grand Junction is located in Western Colorado, 260 miles west of Denver and 295 miles east of Salt Lake City on U.S. 50, 6 and 24.

The city is served by two airlines, one railway and one major bus service. Its metropolitan population is estimated at 37,000.

Situated at 4,587 feet above sea level, Grand Junction is a wholesale trade, retail, livestock, mineral, oil, gas, medical and sports center of the broad Colorado Plateau.

Nearby scenic attractions include the Grand Mesa, Colorado National Monument and numerous exciting canyon roads. An average of only 8 inches of rain falls annually on Grand Junction and winters are bright, sunny and mild.

The city boasts the finest park system in Western Colorado, including two swimming pools. Other facilities in the area are two golf courses, many picnic areas, lighted baseball, tennis and football areas and a number of gymnasiums.

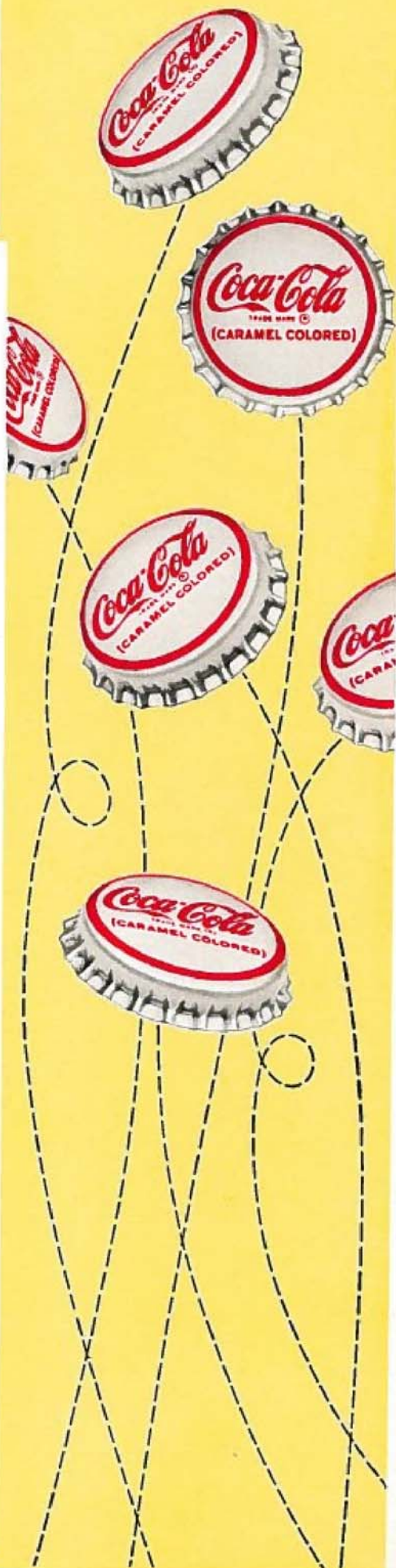

PAST TOURNAMENTS

1966—Nassau Community College of Garden City, N. Y. won its first national title with a come-from-behind victory over Miami-Dade College of Miami, Fla., 9-6. Joe Arnold, the Miami-Dade pitcher, was selected as the tourney's most valuable player while Miami catcher Bob Stinson was named the player most likely to succeed in professional baseball. Steve Lohrer of Nassau was the tourney's leading hitter.

1965—Phoenix College won its third national title with a 9-6 victory over Gulf Coast College of Panama City, Fla. Tom Burgess of the Bears won three games and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Tom Robson of Phoenix was meet's top hitter with 13 hits in 24 times at bat.

1964—Miami-Dade College of Miami, Fla., swamps the Mesa College Mavericks 19-5 in the final game. Mack Gendreau of the Mavs is voted most valuable player and sets tournament strikeout record with 31. Gendreau, Barry Lersh, Bob Andrews and Jerry Chick named to all-tournament team.

1963—Wilmington, N.C. wins second juco title by beating Manatee, Fla., 9-2. Ken Widman of Long Island, N. Y. is most valuable player while Phil Dickens of Mantee is voted most likely to succeed in professional baseball and signs \$50,000 bonus contract after tournament. Tex Tolman, Bucky Hakes and Mike DerManuel of Mesa on all-tourney team.

1962—Phoenix College claims second national title by upsetting defending champion Wilmington, N. C., 13-5. Lee McFarland, Phoenix pitcher is named most valuable player while 17-year-old George Jones of Trinidad College sets tournament batting record with sensational .647 average.

1961—Wilmington, N. C., wins first tournament title by whipping Mesa College in finals and semi-final, 8-3 and 16-9 respectively. Randy Dow, Warner Brooks and Pete Lovrich of Mesa named to all-tournament team. Ron Durham of Wilmington named Most Valuable Player.
