## ***Howdy Friend! This is Grand Junction, the hub of Colorado West***



Grand Junction is located in the Grand Valley at the junction of the Colorado (formerly Grand) and the Gunnison Rivers—from which it derives its name—and also at the junction of the U.S. Highways 6 & 24 and 50, and Interstate 70. It is also the northern terminal of Highway 141 which affords access to the rich uranium producing area extending several hundred miles to the south and west. The population of the Grand Junction metropolitan area is presently estimated at 50,612. The average rainfall is slightly over eight inches and the altitude is 4,587.

Cool Grand Mesa, pictured here, is a fascinating scenic and recreational wonderland. With an altitude of nearly two miles, if this table land were a series of peaks it would be a mountain range. Imposing as the world's largest flat top mountain, its 34,000 acres is matted with tall timber, over 300 bodies of water and acres of wild flowers.

One mile higher than the peach growing valley below, Grand Mesa stands there because, some 600 million years ago, lava 300 feet thick flowed and formed a cap on the then level plateau. Since that time, the Gunnison and Colorado rivers have carved out the Grand Valley, actually a canyon 32 miles long and 20 miles wide.

Sixty of the lakes on Grand Mesa are stocked with Rainbow, Native and Brook trout and is the fly fisherman's paradise. Fishing gear, supplies and boats are available. In season, deer, bear and elk are hunted and guides can be engaged. Recreational facilities, public camp grounds, and rental cabins are available.

Summer activities include this Junior College Baseball Tournament, Melodrama, Pari-Mutuel Horse Racing, Horse Shows, Art Fairs, Invitational Swim Meet, Rocky Mountain Open Golf Tournament, Drag strip races, Rodeo, rides at Powderhorn ski lift, rowboat racing and relays, timed fishing contests, jeep trips, jet boat and raft trips, scenic tours, chartered flights, and a great Museum with wonderful attractions including one of the finest small arms collection in the West.

In the fall there is fabulous hunting all around Grand Junction. Deer, elk and mountain lion are among the favorites.

Winter brings skiing on the Grand Mesa at Powderhorn and snowmobiling as well as ice fishing. Come and spend your next vacation, whether summer or winter, with us. You and your family will enjoy it—we're sure!

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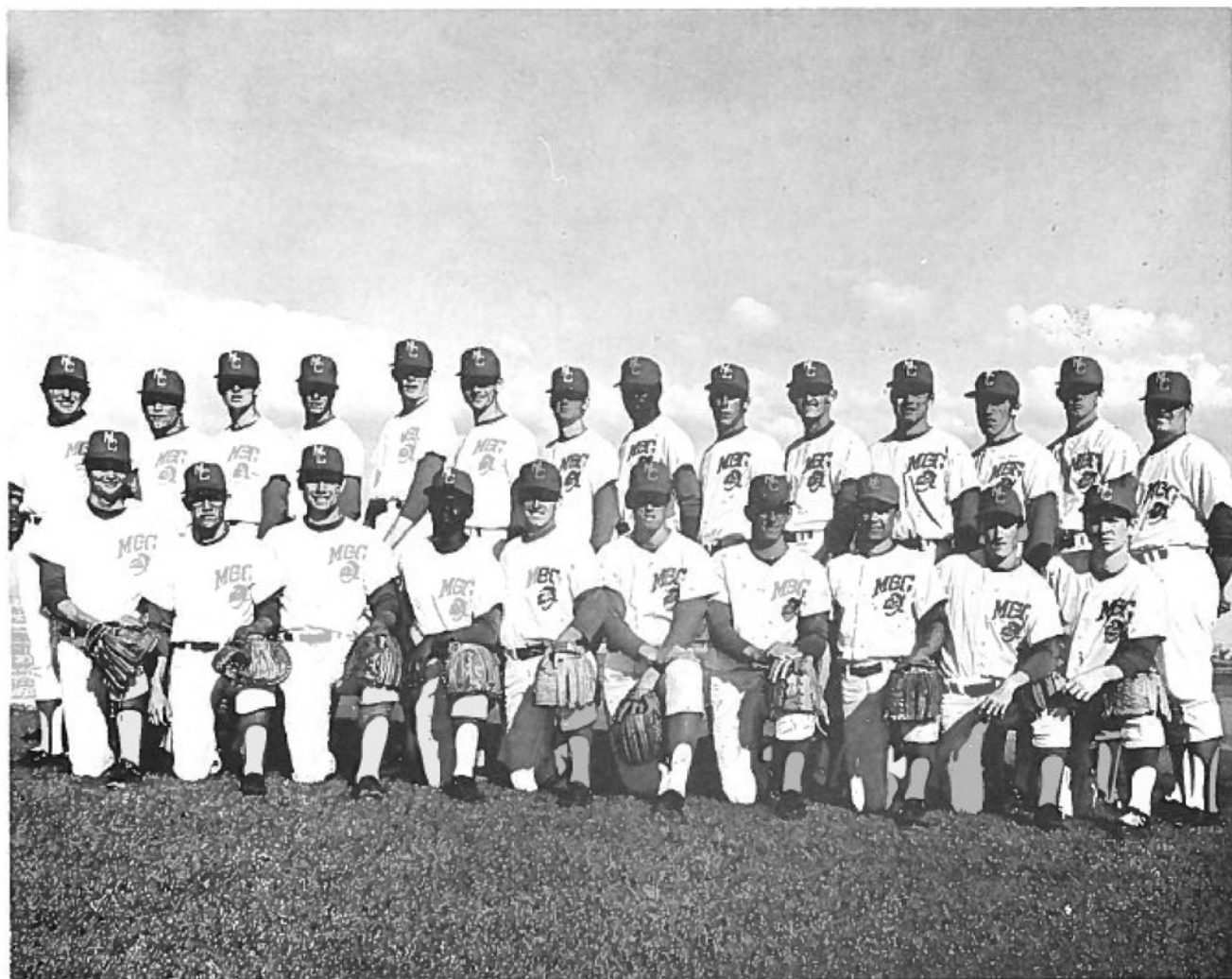

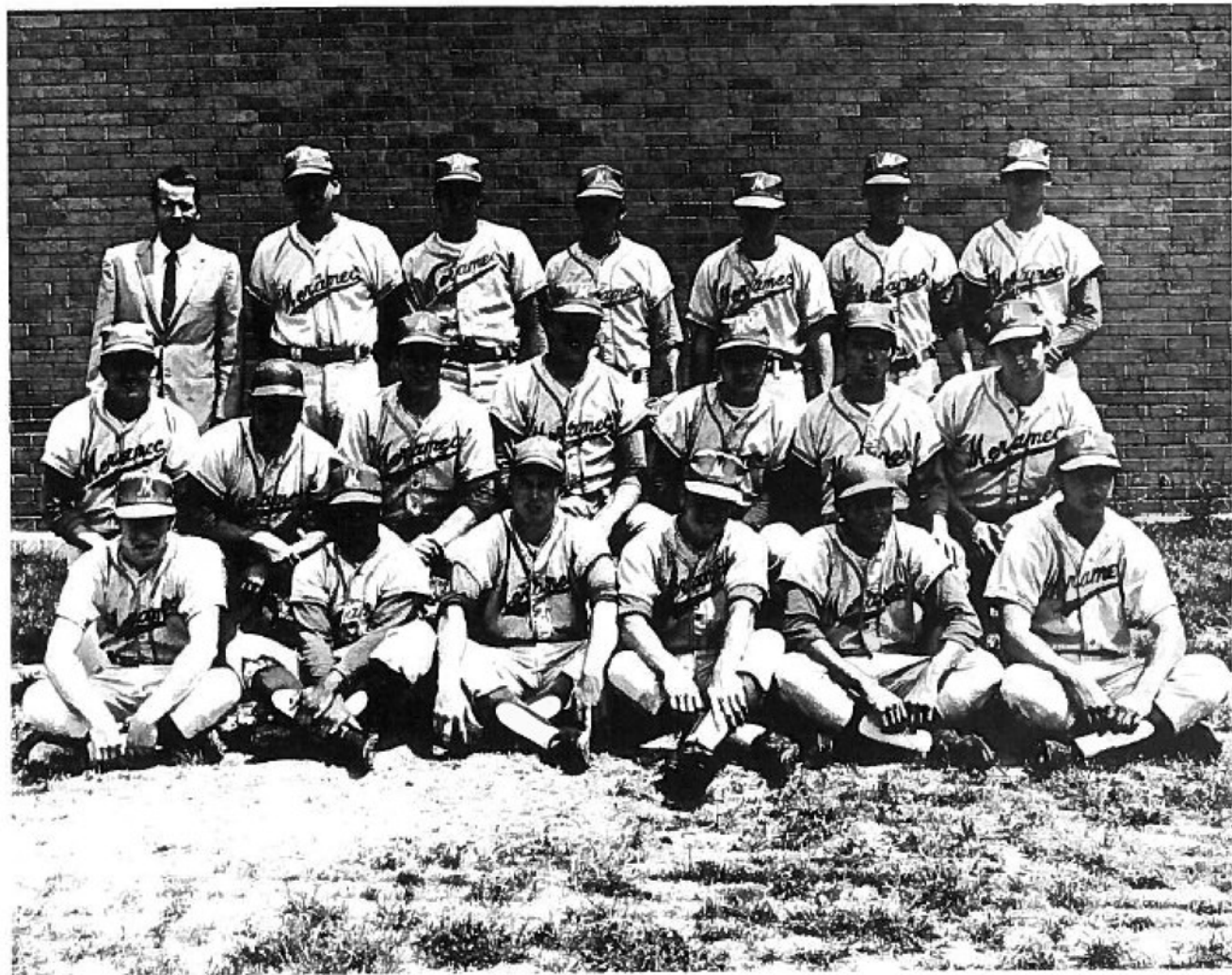

## PAST TOURNAMENTS

1969—Panola College of Carthage, Tex., used only 12 players in the six-day, double-elimination but the lack of depth did not hamper the tireless Texans from capturing the national title with an 8-6 victory over Mesa, Ariz. Most Valuable Player honors went to Doug Ault, who won three games in the tournament for Panola, and hit .318. Ault played in the outfield when not pitching. Randy Bayer, a 6-5 first baseman with sprinter speed from Mesa, Ariz., was voted the player most likely to succeed.

1968—Glendale Community College battled the odds to win the national crown. The Gauchos dropped their tournament opener 15-8 at the hands of Manatee College but rebounded to win five straight games and the crown. Glendale's Otis McCowan was selected as the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

1967—The Bacone Warriors lashed out 16 hits to defeat Odessa 10-4 for the national title. Gerald Pirtle of Bacone was the recipient of the most valuable player award, Ed Bravo of Miami-Dade was to top hitter with a .500 average and Larry Koch of Nassau was voted the most likely to succeed.

1966—Nassau Community College of Garden City, N. Y. won its first national title with a come-from-behind victory over Miami-Dade College of Miami, Fla., 9-6. Joe Arnold, the Miami-Dade pitcher, was selected as the tourney's most valuable player while Miami catcher Bob Stinson was named the player most likely to succeed in professional baseball. Steve Lohrer of Nassau was the tourney's leading hitter.

1965—Phoenix College won its third national title with a 9-6 victory over Gulf Coast College of Panama City, Fla. Tom Burgess of the Bears won three games and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player. Tom Robson of Phoenix was meet's top hitter with 13 hits in 24 times at bat.

1964—Miami-Dade College of Miami, Fla., swamps the Mesa College Mavericks 19-5 in the final game. Mack Gendreau of the Mavs is voted most valuable player and sets tournament strikeout record with 31. Gendreau, Barry Lersch, Bob Andrews and Jerry Chick named to all-tournament team.

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## A MONUMENTAL MONUMENT



Colorado National Monument near Grand Junction is a unique sort of attraction.

You can't buy souvenirs or hot dogs at roadside stands. You can't hunt and you can't fish. You can't huddle around a campfire and listen to some cowpoke fabricate yarns of the old West.

But you can see fantastically eroded red sandstone monoliths and sheer canyon walls dropping down 1,000 feet to the floor of the Grand Valley—without ever leaving your car.

A 22 mile paved road along the canyon rims connects the two entrances to the park and ties onto short, paved approach roads from Grand Junction and Fruita. The 18,120 acre national park was set aside from all other uses than recreation in 1911.

Across the Grand Valley, the tourist sees the Bookcliffs, a group of small mountains so named because they tier northward from the valley like books on a shelf.

The sandstone was set down millions of years ago by inland seas and the sandstone became the burial ground of dinosaurs; fossils of five species aren't difficult to find by the person willing to climb over some pretty rugged terrain.

Another rare specimen of American wildlife can be seen alive. About 20 head of buffalo roam the canyon floors. The monument is a paradise for birds and bird-watchers. It's refuge, too, for elk, deer, fox, coyotes, and porcupines.

There are picnic and camping grounds with water, picnic tables, fireplaces, shelter, and comfort stations.

It's best suited for a quiet, easy drive and a picnic overlooking a canyon rim. The road is passable all year and the noonday sun is always warm.

Sitting on the soft, warm sand, looking down at the pinnacle-like monument which gave its name to Colorado National Monument, in the uncluttered quiet, is like seeing the earth when it was young.
