2013 BANQUET SPEAKER

Rob Miech

Sports Writer Rob Miech is the 2013 JUCO Banquet Speaker.

Bryce Harper took junior college baseball and the JUCO World Series by storm in 2010 as he and the College of Southern Nevada qualified for the national tournament in Grand Junction. Just a short time after the tournament, Harper signed a \$9.9 million contract with the Washington Nationals and quickly rose through the minor leagues capping off his 2012 season winning the National League Rookie of the Year.

Las Vegas sports writer, Rob Miech's book, *The Last Natural*, chronicled Harper's make-or-break season at CSN. Jamie Hamilton read the book and reached out to Miech to speak at the banquet. When the announcement was made, Hamilton said, "Miech is a great storyteller and we're very pleased he is coming to speak at our banquet."

Miech spent the 2010 season with the CSN Coyotes mingling in the dugout, the locker room, on the team bus, and in motel rooms. In his book, Miech delivers an account of the 17-year olds only season in collegiate baseball detailing Harper's journey towards winning the 2010 Golden Spike award as the top amateur baseball player and becoming the number 1 selection in the 2010 Major League Baseball draft.

Miech has been a sports writer for 25 years. During that time he mostly covered college basketball including the UCLA Bruins who went on to become the 1994-95 national champions. While living in Los Angeles, Miech also covered more than 500 MLB games and is convinced that prepared him for his biggest writing venture. Miech has won several awards during his career and his work has appeared in CBS Sportsline, MLB.com, The Washington Post, USA Today, and the Las Vegas Sun.

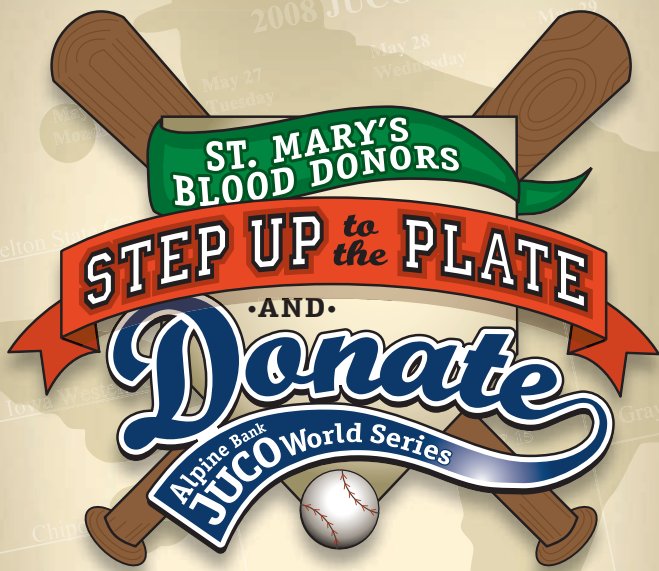

San Jacinto continued to play winning baseball during the tournament as they advanced to the championship game for a rematch of the tournament opener.

The Iowa Western-San "Jac" finale would not disappoint the Grand Junction crowd. Both teams played hard knowing the title was on the line. In the end, Iowa Western claimed their 2nd national championship when they pulled out a 6-5 victory.

SCOREKEEPING MADE EASY

Each year at the JUCO World Series I have watched fans feverishly fill out their score sheets in the program. To be honest, I have no idea what all that scribbling means. This JUCO will be different. I am going to fill out my score sheets, but how do I do it? If you are like me, this looks like a daunting task, but never fear because together we will walk through the 101 of "Score Keeping Made Easy".

This where many a rocket scientist has realized he is not as smart as he thought he was. There are lots of variations on keeping score, for this exercise we will focus on the easy way. Inside each box is a diagram of a baseball field. I will give a half inning example, batter by batter. On the side of the my scorecard below you can follow along.

Top of the first inning:

The first batter is **Davidson**. He strikes out swinging. His box would be filled in with a large "K". This is important and not to be confused with a backward "K", which is for a batter who strikes out without swinging.

The next batter, **Smith**, hits a ball to the shortstop (position 6). The shortstop (position 6) then throws to the first baseman (position 3) and the runner is called out. This would be scored as a "6 - 3" in Garigen's box.

The next batter is **Phillips**. He hits a single to left field. This would be scored by drawing **a line from home plate to first base**. Then at first base "1B" is written to indicate this was a one base hit.

The next batter, **Lee**, draws a walk. This would be scored by drawing a line to first base, then entering a "W" next to first base. You also need to now go to Davis' box and draw a line from first base to second base, because he has now moved to second base.

The next batter, **Woods**, hits a homerun and the famous song by Pat Benatar "Hit me with your best shot" blares in the background while you **draw a line around the diamond** and write an "HR" to the right of the diamond. In Johnson's and Davis' boxes **fill in the diamond** to indicate that they scored. This is a reminder that this is "Scorekeeping made easy," so to learn what "HR" stands for please refer to your "Stats Made Easy" page, which is the page to the right.

Now the next batter, **Burns**, hits a fly ball to center field that is caught for the final out. Mark the box with an "8" which means that center fielder made the out. Draw a diagonal line "I" at the bottom right hand corner of the box to indicate the top half of the inning has ended.

You have now graduated and know enough to be dangerous. If at any time you get confused, just draw a bunch of lines and write in a bunch of numbers. Everyone around you will think you are brilliant. Good luck and enjoy this year's "2013 Alpine Bank JUCO World Series!"

- **First things first**, every position has a number. On the score sheet you will see a baseball field with numbers **1 through 9**. I've labeled a sticky note below with the respective positions for your reference.
- **On the top of the score sheet** going left to right you will see numbers **1 thru 10**. These indicate each inning of the game. On the left hand vertical column is the area where you can write in the starting line up for each team.
- **On the page to your right** you will see all the abbreviations for **"Baseball Stats Made Easy"**. These are numbers and abbreviations that are needed to keep score for a game. The score sheet, if read and marked properly, can successfully guide you through a baseball game.

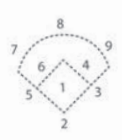

GREAT TOURNAMENT PLAYERS

The Junior College World Series is underway and visions of a national championship are in the minds of every player in the tournament. Shortly after the tournament, each player's hopes and dreams of the past week transform into dreams of a future major league career as the baseball draft begins. For the athletes, the draft provides some direction for their future: their formal competitive playing career may abruptly come to an end; they may have an opportunity to continue to play competitive at a 4-year university; or their dream of a major league career is further fueled after being selected in the draft.

Since the inception of the JUCO tournament, the JUCO committee has tried to identify past JUCO tournament players that were selected in the baseball draft AND were fortunate enough to play in a major league game. It might surprise you to know that we have had some big significant league players pass through our tournament.



Dating back to 1960, the JUCO tournament has seen approximately 115 players make the trek up to the big leagues. JUCO fans had the opportunity to watch 8 players in 1983 and 1991 play in the tournament that went on to make an appearance in the major leagues. The tournament that saw the most future big leaguers was 1982 when fans watched 10 future major league stars play. Reviewing the 20 selections for the JUCO 50th Anniversary team, 50% of that group saw major league action.

In 2010, there was a great deal of excitement throughout baseball surrounding the selection of Bryce Harper from the College of Southern Nevada as the first pick in the major league draft. This was the first time that the first player selected was from our JUCO alumni. However, he was not the only 1st round selection coming from one of our tournament teams. Out of the approximately 115 major leaguers to have played in the JUCO Tournament, 12 players were selected as 1st round draft picks. Out of this group, 7 players were selected within the first 7 draft picks (1 as the 1st pick, 3 as the 3rd selection, 2 as the 4th selection, and 1 as the 7th selection).

The success of some of our JUCO alumni prospered after they began their major league career. It might surprise you to know that we have had 17 of our JUCO alumni make appearances in a Major League All-Star game. Seven of these players made appearances in multiple All-Star games. Before we get back to watching baseball, let's take a moment to think back on those big names I mentioned.

In 1986, Yavapai College brought a young pitcher by the name of Curt Schilling who went on to make 6 All-Star appearances. In 2001 Curt added a World Series MVP award to his playing resume.

David Wells came to our Tournament in 1982 with Middle Georgia College. David also made 3 appearances in All-Star games. Many of you might recall that in 1998 while pitching for the Yankees, David pitched a perfect game. In Major League Baseball history, only 23 people have ever pitched a perfect game. "Boomer," as he was affectionately nicknamed, capped off his 1998 season with an MVP award from the American League Championship Series.

Also in 1982, Triton College brought a future all-star with them. The late Kirby Puckett brought a big bat with him and established the highest batting average for the JUCO tournament at .688. Kirby went on to play with the Minnesota Twins and made 10 appearances in All-Star games. Kirby was the 1991 AL ALCS and the 1993 All Star MVP. Unfortunately, his playing career was cut short due to a retina condition. Just 6 years after his playing career, Kirby reached the pinnacle of his baseball career when he was selected to the Baseball Hall of Fame in 2001. Kirby is the only member of our JUCO alumni to achieve this prestigious honor.

In his only collegiate season Bryce Harper played for the College of Southern Nevada during the 2010 Tournament and went on to be the first player selected in the 2010 draft. Bryce began the 2012 season at Triple-A before making his first appearance in the big leagues with the Washington Nationals in late April. National League manager Tony LaRussa selected Bryce as one of his reserve players for the 2012 team making him the youngest position player in major league history to be selected to an All-Star team. This 2010 JUCO player, who has been called a baseball prodigy, capped off his rookie season by being selected as the National League Rookie of the Year. This is also a first for a JUCO alumnus. With such a strong rookie season, it is hard to say just where he will rank among the JUCO elite.

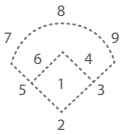

How Is It Made?

As we all sit in the stands watching the boys of summer throw and smack the baseball around, did you ever wonder how baseballs are made? This just might cross the minds of a few of the most passionate baseball fans. For the rest of us, here is the short production version.

It all starts with a small round piece of rubberized cork covered in 2 layers of rubber, actually smaller than a golf ball. This unseen part of the ball is called "the pill" which has been affectionately used as a slang term to refer to the baseball. The pill is next covered by winding 121 yards of 4-ply wool yarn

over the pill, followed by another 45 yards of a 3-ply wool yarn, and a third layer consisting of another 53 yards of a 3-ply yarn. Each layer is very distinct in color and texture helping to give the ball its size and shape. The last layer that is wound over the pill is 53 yards of a poly-cotton blend that is smooth to give the final product added strength to avoid tears and flat spots after being hit. That's a total of 272 yards of yarn around the pill!

The cover is made of cowhide. The leather is cut into pieces that resemble the number 8 with holes along the edges for final stitching. Each baseball requires 2 pieces of leather that are placed around the wound yarn and are held in place with glue in preparation for stitching. The stitching around a baseball is typically red. Each ball uses 88 inches of waxed thread and has 108 stitches to complete the assembly. Amazingly, even with the technology we have today, the stitching is still done by hand. An experienced person can handle the needle and strings to complete the entire stitching process within 13-15 minutes.

After the ball is stitched, it is run through a press that rolls the ball around and around to remove any imperfections in the shape of the ball. The ball is run through the quality control process to ensure each ball weighs between 5 and 5.25 ounces and measures between 9 and 9.25 inches in circumference before it receives a final stamp of approval from Rawlings and Major League Baseball.

The next time you are holding a baseball, take a minute to appreciate the skill that goes into stitching one of these pills, taters, rocks, or whatever you want to call it. When it's done, it's still a baseball.

Norm has moved to Denver to lead the expansion of their banking services but his heart will always be with the western slope community.





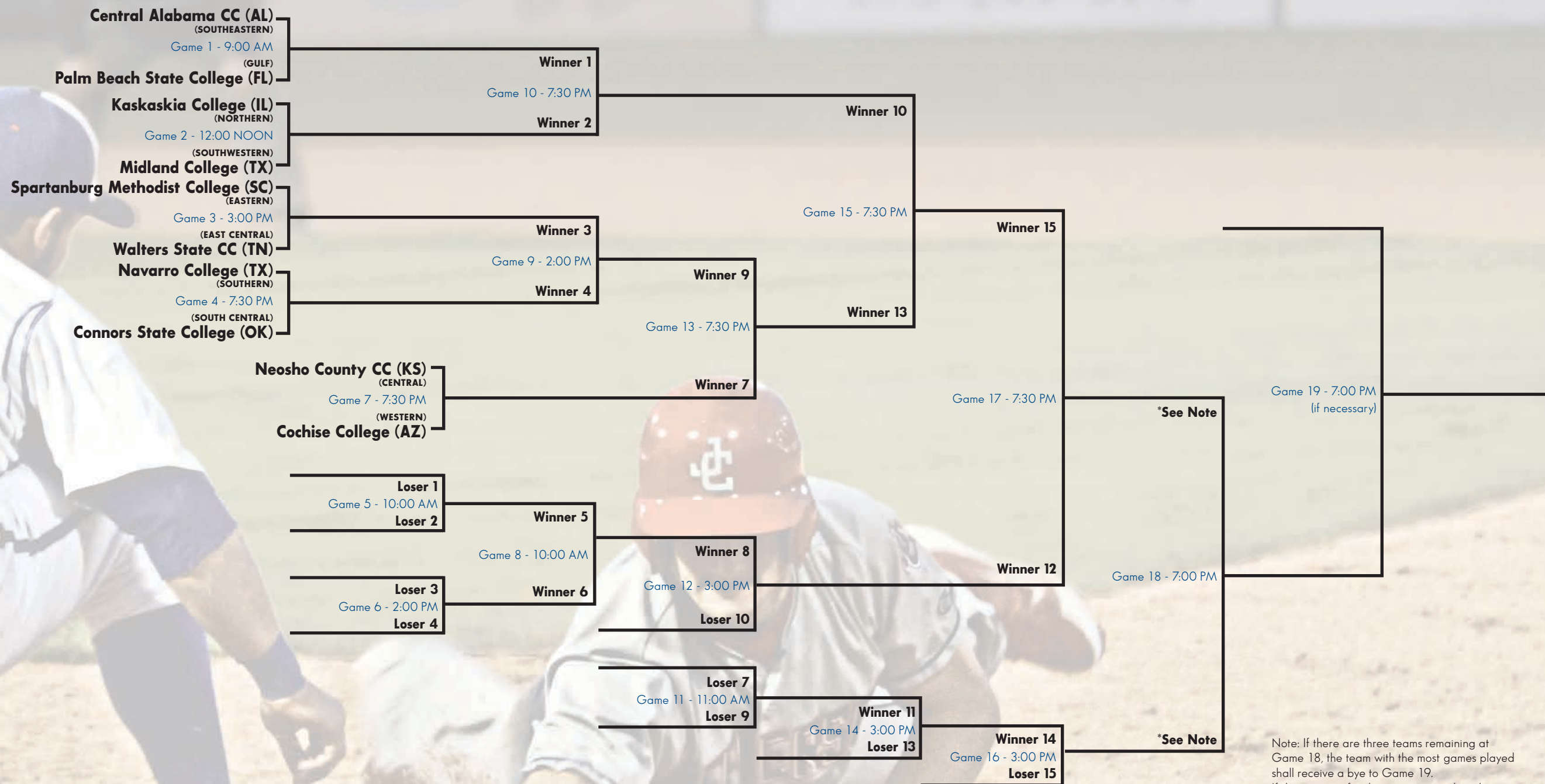

SAM Suplezio Field Makeover RECOGNIZED NATIONALLY

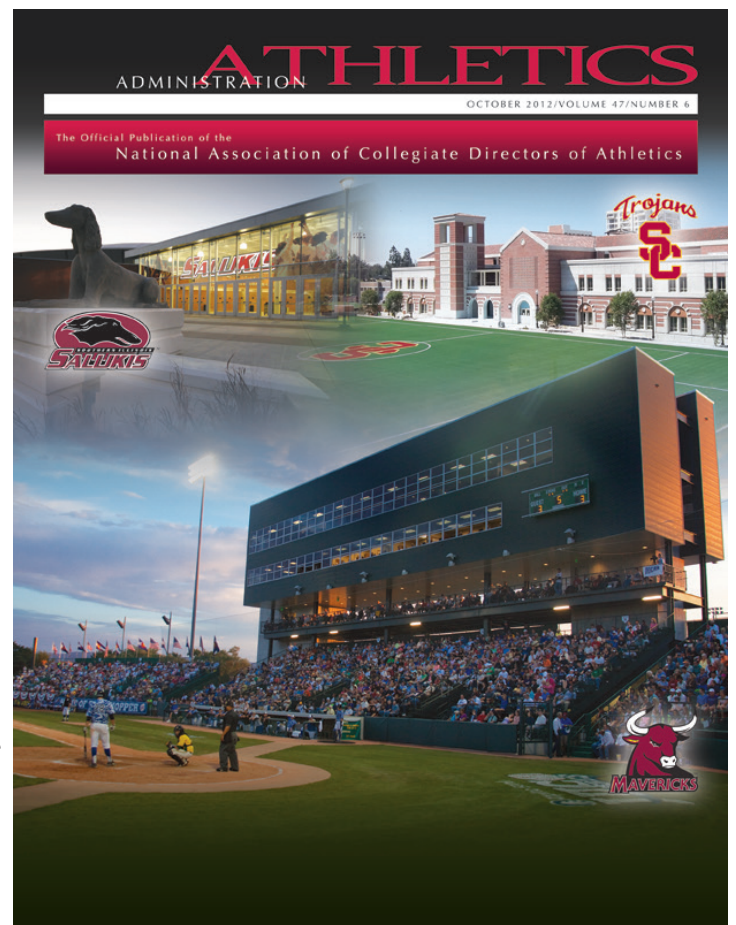

Late in the summer of 2012 the field makeover received a nomination for a 2012 Sports Travel award by "SportsTravel" magazine for the Best Sports Event Series or Circuit. Just receiving a nomination was exciting. Other 2012 events in this category were: Big East Men's Basketball Tournament, CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) Basketball Tournament, NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, and the NCAA Women's College Softball World Series. We were competing in the same category as some huge Division I college events. After seeing the other nominations, we knew we were in a very elite group of events.

This was another big honor to share the spotlight with a national audience.

In the end, the winner of the "SportsTravel" magazine Best Collegiate Sports Event Series or Circuit went to the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. We have no doubt that our event is pretty special to all the participants and spectators that make a trip to the Junior College World Series. Just being mentioned in the same category as some very big Division I events validates our tournament as a class act to attend!

Gov. VANDERHOOF

In our continued effort to honor members of our community who have served in our armed forces, each year the JUCO committee selects a local veteran to be honored prior to the 7:30 pm game during the special Memorial Day festivities. The May 27, 2013 honoree is former Colorado Governor John Vanderhoof. Please join us as we thank Governor Vanderhoof for his service and congratulate him on his 91st birthday! Stick around for fireworks after the game.

Governor Vanderhoof is a life-long Colorado resident. He originally joined the Civilian Pilot Training program and served with the famed entertainer, Jimmy Stewart. After completing the training he went on to join the Navy and served as a pilot during World War II. During his military career, Governor Vanderhoof experienced combat missions in the Pacific Campaign and was one of the first Navel pilots to takeoff at night and he served as part of the first wave during the mission to secure Iwo Jima.

Gary Harmon from the Grand Junction Daily Sentinel spoke to Vanderhoof last year and reported that, "While serving in the South Pacific as an F-6 Grumman Hellcat fighter pilot, Vanderhoof shot down four enemy planes and once spent more than 20 days bobbing in the Coral Sea before he was rescued. In fact, he had been declared dead, and President Franklin Roosevelt signed his death certificate."

Harmon also discovered that Vanderhoof's final mission was part of a raid on an air strip on the southern end of Luzon in

the Philippines. After his plane was struck by enemy fire he was unable to land on the U.S.S. Bunker Hill. He was forced to ditch his airplane in the sea which resulted in him shattering his leg. He was sent to the Hotel Colorado in Glenwood Springs which had been converted to a navy hospital for his recovery.

After being shot down three times, Vanderhoof was discharged and remained in Glenwood Springs where he began a new life of public service in state government. During his political career he served as a State Representative for 20 years. He became the first elected Lt. Governor in Colorado and was appointed as the 37th Governor of Colorado when his predecessor accepted a position in the Nixon administration.

During his military service, Vanderhoof was awarded three Air Medals, two purple hearts, and the Distinguished Flying Cross for "heroism or extraordinary achievement as an aviator." Other well-known recipients of the Distinguished Flying Cross are George H. W. Bush, Jimmie Doolittle, John Glenn, and John McCain.

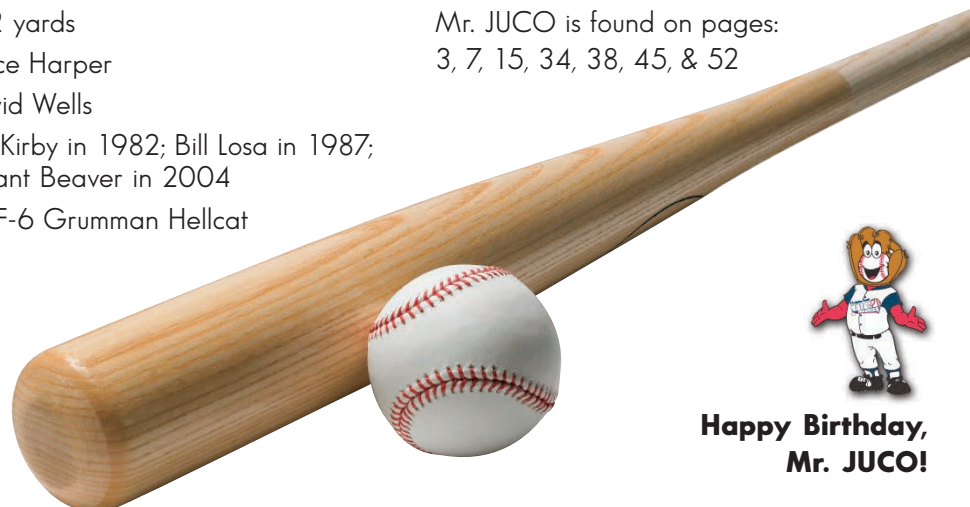

FORMER JUCO ALL-STAR IN DODGER FRONT OFFICE

Former Mesa College (1969) and NJCAA All-Star, Bob Engle, was named as the Vice President of International Scouting for the Los Angeles Dodgers in November 2012.

Engle came to Mesa College after a tour of duty in the Army. As Pennsylvania natives, Bob and his wife, Barbara, had no idea what was in store for their future. Bob played baseball for the Mavericks for two years and then went on to Colorado University before embarking on his tremendous big league career. While attending Mesa College, then an NJCAA school, Engle played in the JUCO Tournament and was selected to the All-Tourney team as a catcher in the 1969 Tournament. He was also selected as a member of the Junior College World Series Golden Anniversary All-Tournament Team as part of the Tournament's 50th Anniversary celebration.

Bob began his major league career in 1974 when he was hired by the Baltimore Orioles as the Midwest Scouting Supervisor. In 1976 he moved to the Toronto Blue Jay organization as the Eastern Regional Supervisor where he met baseball Hall of Famer Pat Gillick. In 1982, Bob was promoted to the Eastern Regional Scouting Director and he moved into the Director of Scouting role in 1990. Bob remained with the Blue Jays through 2000 holding positions of Assistant General Manager and Senior Advisor of Baseball Operations. Engle joined the Mariners in 2000 as the Senior Advisor to the Vice President



and General Manager of Baseball Operations. In 2004 he took on the job as Director of International Relations and was promoted to Vice President of International Operations in 2007. In 2011, Engle was selected as the east coast Scout of the Year. During his Major League career, Bob has been instrumental in signing four Cy Young Award winners: Roy Halladay, Chris Carpenter, Pat Hentgen, and Felix Hernandez.

Commenting on his collegiate playing career, Engle cited the coaches at the junior college level as "critical" influences on his life and career. Engle had some very special memories of Mesa Junior College (now Colorado Mesa University). He specifically wanted to thank Coach Dan MacKendrick and the late Coach Bus Bergman for the guidance and influence they provided on his professional and personal development.

Donald Green
Head Coach, 1967-96
Jefferson State Community College

For 28 years Donald Green piloted the baseball program at Jefferson State Community College in Birmingham, Ala. He compiled a 622-428 (.592) career mark in the NJCAA, which ranked him in the top 20 all-time among inactive coaches in the association when he retired in 1996.

Green's teams won the Alabama Community College Conference (ACCC) North Division 10 times and twice captured the Region 22 title. He was named the North Division Coach of the Year on nine occasions and was a two-time Region 22 Coach of Year recipient.

In addition to coaching, Green promoted baseball in the Alabama region, serving as president of the ACCC Baseball Committee for three years. From 1991 through 1996, he held the position of Athletic Director at Jefferson State.

A native of Birmingham, he was an accomplished athlete at Jones Valley High School. He attended Florida State University and Samford University on football scholarships, lettering three years at Samford, where he earned his Bachelor of Science degree. He later earned a Master of Arts degree from the University of Alabama.

He was inducted into the Alabama Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2001 and the ACCC Hall of Fame in 2004. Green passed away on April 14, 2011 after a long battle with cancer.

Miami Dade College

Steve Hertz spent a quarter century as the head baseball coach at Miami Dade College. During his tenure, his teams finished as either the champions or runners up of the

Southern Conference 19 times (10 championships / 9 runners-up). Even more impressive, his teams advanced to the Region 8/ Gulf District tournament 19 times during his 26 seasons as head coach.

His 2001 squad won the Gulf District title, advancing to the JUCO World Series where they finished fifth.

Miami Dade was consistently ranked in the top 10 nationally under Hertz and he was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year 10 times and Region 8/Gulf District Coach of the Year once.

He retired in 2010 with a career NJCAA mark of 945-325 (.750). He is one of just 36 coaches in NJCAA history with 900 or more career victories. Including a combined 15 years as the head coach at Coral Park and Southridge high schools in Miami, Hertz's all-time coaching record stands at 1,245-420 (.748) over 41 years.

More than 150 players tutored by Hertz signed professional contracts, including four currently in Major League Baseball - Placido Polanco (MDC 1993-94); Andres Torres (MDC 1997-98); Jon Albaladejo (MDC 2000-01); and Jesus Feliciano (MDC 1998).

Hertz has also coached at the international level. He helped Team USA win gold at the 1999 Pan American Maccabi Games as an assistant coach. Returning to the same tournament in 2003, Hertz was head coach of Team USA and led the squad to the gold medal. In 2007, he led the Tel Aviv Lightning to the semifinals of the inaugural season of the Israel Professional Baseball League.

A notable baseball player during his time, he signed a professional contract with the Houston Col 45's in 1963 and made his MLB debut that year at the age of 19 - the eighth youngest player that season. In the minor leagues he twice was an All-Star (1965 Western Carolina League and 1966 Florida State League). He concluded his professional career in 1969 at the Triple-A level with the New York Mets affiliate in Tidewater, Va.

Hertz is a member of the following halls of fame: Florida College System Activities Association (2007), Coral Park High School (2006) and Miami High School (1985).



Jim 'Skip' Walker
Head Coach, 1974-2004
College of Southern Idaho

Jim Walker led one of the most successful baseball programs in the western United States for 30 years. As the head coach at the College Southern Idaho, Walker guided the Golden Eagles to regional and national success.

Walker's teams captured the Scenic West Conference/NJCAA Region 18 championship 12 times during his tenure. In addition, the Golden Eagles claimed eight NJCAA Western District titles, advancing to the JUCO World Series. At the national tournament in Grand Junction, CSI won a national championship in 1984 and also placed third in 1988, fourth in 1986 and 1994, and fifth in 1976.

In addition to his success with CSI, Walker has also helped Team USA to success on the diamond. In 1980 he was the assistant coach for Team USA at the World Games in Japan and the Friendship Games in Korea and Taiwan. In 1987 and '88 he again was an assistant for Team USA squads that participated in the World Games in Canada and Venezuela. In 1998 he was an advisor for the Netherlands Olympic team.

Walker retired as the head coach at CSI in 2004 with an overall career record of 1,061-349 (.752). He is one of just 22 coaches in NJCAA history to reach 1,000 career victories. He was inducted into the CSI Athletics Hall of Fame in 2003 and the college's baseball facility was named his honor the same year. In 2012 he was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

Forever a baseball coach, Walker continues to be a part of the Golden Eagles program as an assistant coach. His son, Boomer, is currently in his eighth season as CSI's head coach.



Bruce Hill
Tournament Vice Chairman,
1987-present
NJCAA JUCO World Series
Grand Junction, Colo.

A native of Grand Junction, Bruce Hill has helped advance significant improvements and success to the NJCAA Division I World Series over the past three decades. He first volunteered with the local JUCO Tournament Committee in Grand Junction in 1987 as a team host and marketing director. It didn't take long before Hill was tabbed to his current position as Tournament Vice Chairman.

Hill's passion and dedication to the JUCO World Series has been instrumental in the overall operation of the event each year. He has been a true ambassador for the JUCO World Series, Grand Junction and the NJCAA, volunteering his time traveling and advising college coaches and administrators in regards to the tournament.

Likely his greatest contributions took place during his tenure as City Councilman (2003-12) and Mayor for the City of Grand Junction (2009-11). His understanding and support of the JUCO World Series helped the tournament thrive in conjunction with community support. His leadership was paramount in the build-up and completion of the recent \$8.3 million dollar renovation to Lincoln Park and Sam Suplizio Field, which has hosted the NJCAA's premier baseball championship since 1959.

Hill is the owner and president of Superior Alarm, Inc., of Grand Junction. In 1997 he was honored with the "Citizen of the Year" award from the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce and the 2003 recipient of "Small Business of the Year" award. He most recently was recognized as a Distinguished Alumni to Colorado Mesa University in 2006 for his years of dedication and service to his community.

Grand Junction Loses a Champion of the Community

The entire Grand Junction community was shocked at the sudden and unexpected death of 54-year-old Commander Greg Assenmacher. Assenmacher died of natural causes in January 2013.

Commander Assenmacher began his career at the police department in 1981 and served in nearly every position possible during his police career. As a commander, he was responsible for several high-profile cases including the 2006 bombings and helping to solve a 30-year-old homicide that resulted in the 2009 arrest of a suspect.

Grand Junction Police Chief John Camper said, "Commander Assenmacher has served as one of the most outstanding representatives of the Grand Junction Police Department that we have had. Through his volunteer work with Crime Stoppers, JUCO, multiple Honor Flights for World War II veterans, and countless other outreach activities, his efforts on behalf of the citizens of this community are unparalleled. His commitment to solving crime and making Grand Junction a safer city will not soon be matched. Most important, we all knew him as one of the kindest and most giving men that we have had the pleasure of knowing. He will be deeply missed for years to come."

JUCO Tournament Chairman Jamie Hamilton said, "Greg Assenmacher had only recently accepted a position as an official member of the JUCO committee. However, he provided guidance and safety advice to our tournament for over 30 years. His love of baseball and the community will never be forgotten. He always understood this was and is an event owned by the citizens of Grand Junction and Mesa County...he was a great friend of JUCO."

The JUCO family would like to extend our sympathies to the Assenmacher family and thank them for sharing his wonderful qualities with all of us.

JUCO's Longest Serving Committee Member Dies

In February 2013, the JUCO committee lost our longest serving committee member with the passing of Dr. Hurst Otto.

A practicing Optometrist by profession, Dr. Otto served the JUCO tournament for 53 years as a JUCO Committee member. Dr. Otto helped to ensure that the tournament got off to a great start by serving as the co-chairman of the first JUCO Tournament Committee in 1959 and continued

in that post for five years. He continued to serve the tournament as a Host Committee Chairman for another 38 years, providing the excellent relationship and coordinating assistance in numerous ways to the visiting teams and families. After 43 years, Dr. Otto stepped down as the Host Committee Chairman but continued to serve as a committee member until his retirement in 2011. After his JUCO retirement, Dr. Otto was still considered a valued committee member until his death.

In 2001, Dr. Otto was enshrined in the 60-member JUCO Baseball Coaches Hall Of Fame for his contribution to the NJCAA and the JUCO tournament. The Hall of Fame was established in 1982 to honor those individuals who have contributed to furthering the "Excellence of Baseball Coaching" and the selections are made by the National Junior College Baseball Coaches Association. Since 2002, an additional 31 people have joined Dr. Otto in the Hall of Fame.

Dr. Otto set the bar very high for other committee members. Thank you for establishing the groundwork and helping to make our tournament something special for everyone.

Grand Junction Baseball Icon Dies

On February 8, 2013, the Grand Junction baseball community was saddened to learn of the passing of 91-year-old Bill Fanning.

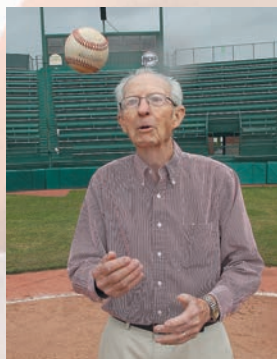
Mr. Fanning was forever known as "Coach" to the hundreds of former players he encountered over his 35-year career as the Grand Junction High School (GJHS) baseball coach. During his high school tenure Coach Fanning was at the helm for a 467-172 record while leading the Tigers to three Colorado state championships. During the 1961 and 1962 state championship seasons Coach Fanning's Tigers won 43 consecutive games.

When he wasn't coaching, you could find him working at some sporting event. Coach Fanning spent 39 years umpiring baseball, 37 years officiating football and 32 years as a basketball official. Fanning umpired 13 consecutive years at the JUCO World Series.

I think the Coaches obituary published on February 12, 2013 in the Grand Junction Daily Sentinel captured what could be his most generous quality, "While coaching was his passion, teaching was his calling. Coach taught World History for 35 years at GJHS and influenced as many students in the classroom as athletes in the ball park. Numerous students have written or called over the years to express their thanks to the coach for influencing their lives. A student from 1958 wrote "I know you don't remember me but you were my history teacher in 1958 and you changed my life. I was kind of a nerdy kid without much motivation or direction. Most of the time in high school I was on auto pilot, just enough to get by but not enough

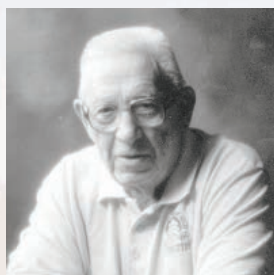
to excel. The one real exception was your class. I found it fun and stimulating.... I was recently selected to receive the Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching.... Thank you Mr. Fanning. A job excellently done on your part has enriched my life."

Coach Fanning received many honors and awards during his lifetime. Patty Arnold from the Daily Sentinel reported that the coach is a member of numerous Colorado and national halls of fame. A few of note are the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame, the University of Colorado Living Legends, Colorado High School Coaches Hall of Fame, and the National High School Sports Hall of Fame. In 2005 Coach Fanning was inducted into JUCO's inaugural class in Home Run Alley.

The JUCO Committee and the NJCAA would like to express our deepest sympathies to the Fanning family. Thank you Coach for making outstanding adults out of so many kids!

JUCO Remembers Si Grantham's Contribution to Tournament

Si Grantham passed away in December 2012. Si was a member of the JUCO committee in the early years of the tournament. Si served as a member of the entertainment committee but could be found helping anyone with whatever activity needed the help. While working on the JUCO committee, Si continued his advocacy for kids when he could be found distributing free game tickets to the kids during his annual school tour.



Si was an incredible community member and was involved with many groups or clubs in the community. It was due to his willingness to be involved that Si became known as "Grand Junction's biggest little angel."

During World War II Si served aboard the USS Cony from 1942-1945. After his discharge, the Grand Junction community became the fortunate recipient of his willingness to make a difference.

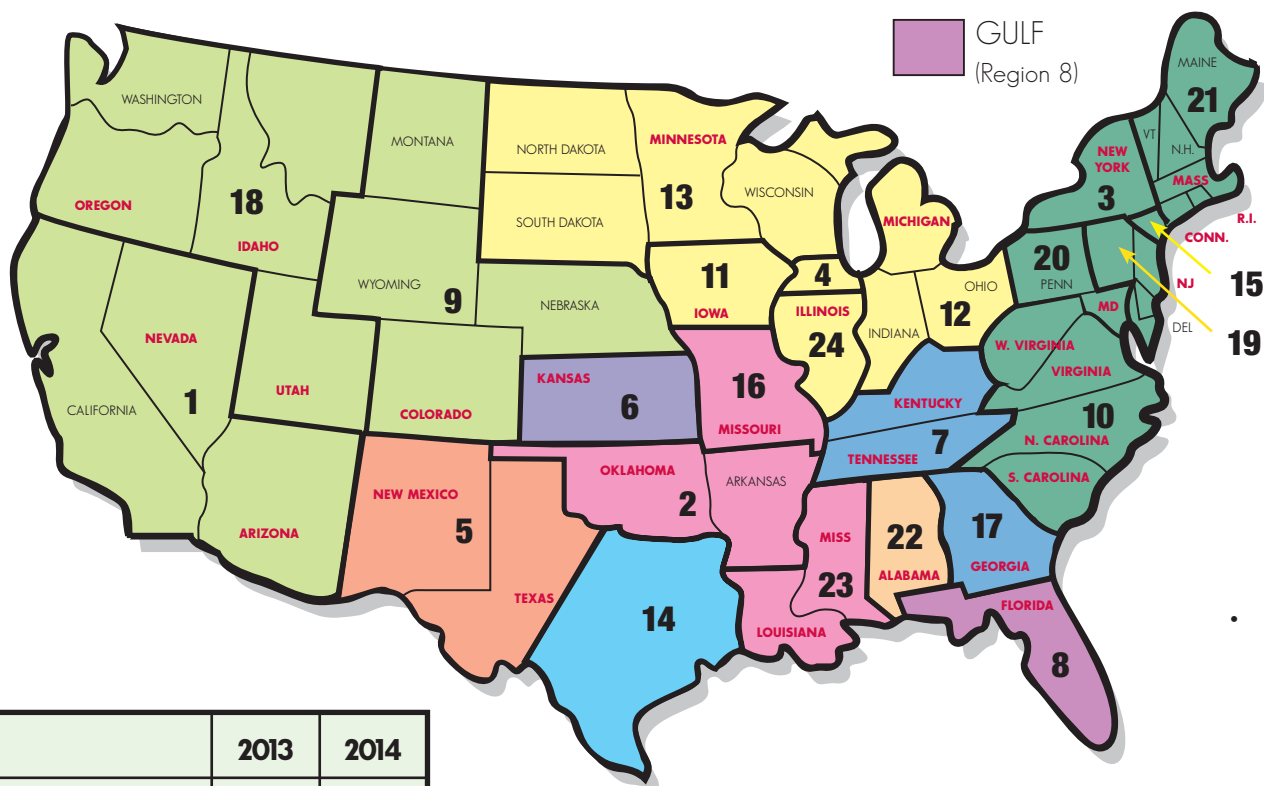

JUCO Rules of Play

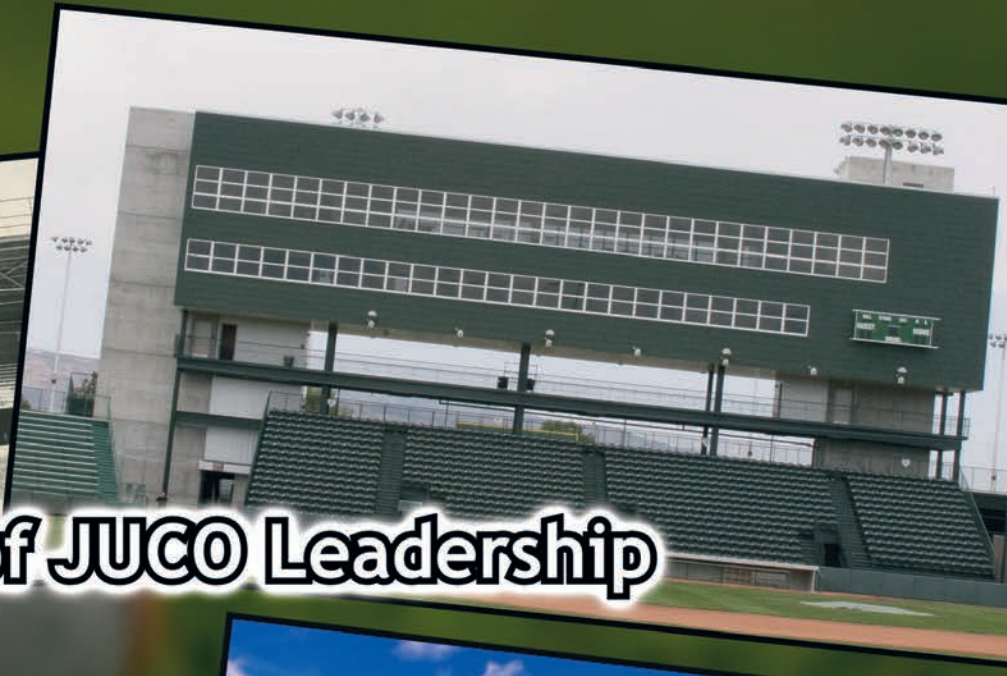
All games will be played under NCAA rules, except for the following changes or additions to these rules which have been adopted by the NJCAA for Tournament play:

- A. All games are scheduled for nine (9) innings.
- B. The ten run (10 run) rule shall be in effect after five (5) complete innings.
- C. The eight run (8 run) rule shall be in effect after seven (7) complete innings.
- D. The championship game (game #19) shall be played the full nine (9) innings regard-less of the score.
- E. Any game delayed because of rain, power failure, etc., shall be resumed at the point of suspension and played a full nine (9) innings unless terminated under rule b or c above.
- F. Optional substitution provision will not apply to Tournament play.
- G. The Home Team will be determined by the flip of a coin prior to each game. The home team will occupy the third base dugout. The tournament directors reserve the right to handle the flip even with out team

representation as the case may arise. Every effort will be made for a team representative to be present (coaching staff).

- H. Tournament Umpires are instructed to keep games moving and will strictly enforce charged conference/pitcher removal rules.
- I. Rules require that double earflap helmets be worn at bat and on the bases.
- J. Protests: No protests will be tolerated on judgement calls. Rule interpretation protests will be decided immediately by the Tournament Director, the NJCAA Representative and the supervisor of officials (if available). The game shall then proceed immediately.
- K. Official line up cards, in duplicate, are to be submitted to the Umpire-In-Chief before each game.
- L. Open wound policy: Under circumstances when constant or profuse bleeding occurs, the appropriate team official following NCAA Baseball Rules may attend to the participant. Should bleeding not be controlled immediately, the player shall be removed from the game.

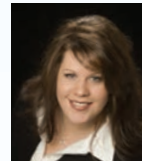
