The NJCAA Baseball Coaches Association has announced its 2016 Baseball Hall of Fame class.

The 2016 NJCAA Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame inductees are: former St. Louis (Mo.) player and current Southwestern Illinois head coach Neil Fiala, former coaches Barry Davis from Rowan Gloucester (N.J.) and Steve Burluson of Kansas City Kansas, along with current Potomac State (W. Va.) coach Doug Little.



Neil Fiala Player/Coach – St. Louis (MO) / Southwestern Illinois

Few individuals in the history of the NJCAA have proven to be as big a winner both as a player and coach as Neil Fiala. From being named MVP of the 1975 NJCAA Baseball World Series to assembling an 817-445 record as a head coach, Fiala has solidified his place in the annals of two-year college athletics.

Named a high school All-American and St. Louis High School Player of the Year in 1974, Fiala was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals but opted not to sign and joined defending NJCAA champion Meramec which has since merged with several institutions into St. Louis. The local product quickly established himself as a team leader and was named MVP of the 1975 NJCAA World Series after spurring the Magic on to a runner-up finish.

Following a successful NCAA DI playing career at Southern Illinois where he was named MVP of the 1977 NCAA Midwest Regional, Fiala was once again drafted by the Cardinals in the 32nd round of the MLB Draft. He'd spend six seasons in the Cardinals and Cincinnati Reds' systems, making appearances in five major league games. After his playing career concluded, Fiala began his coaching career as an assistant at Vianney High School from 1983-86 before returning to Meramec as an assistant in 1987. His last two stops as an assistant included stints with the New York Yankees organization and the Illinois Fighting Illini before he landed his first head coaching job at Southwestern Illinois in 1993.

Now in his 23rd season with the Blue Storm, Fiala's accomplishments at Southwestern Illinois are numerous. His teams have combined for five NJCAA Region 24 championships with 11 players earning NJCAA All-America honors. Fiala's former student-athletes have established a valuable reputation with 44 signing professional contracts and 188 playing baseball at the four-year collegiate level.

Fiala's achievements have been recognized by a number of groups with his induction into the Southwest Kiwanis of St. Louis Hall of Fame in 1991, the Vianney High School Hall of Fame in 1997, the St. Louis Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 2007 and the St. Louis Mon-Clair Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 2014.

Barry Davis
Coach – Rowan Gloucester (NJ)

Claiming four national championships in an 11-year span at Rowan Gloucester – formerly Gloucester County – few coaches have experienced as great of success in such a short span as former Roadrunners head coach Barry Davis. Departing from the NJCAA after the 2000 season, Davis put together a 434-109 record at the two-year college level.

With his arrival in Sewell, New Jersey, in 1990, the Rowan Gloucester program immediately began to experience success. By the time the NJCAA established the DIII level of baseball in 1992, Davis already had the Roadrunners on track to win the program's first national title. Rowan Gloucester won the inaugural

NJCAA DIII Baseball World Series that year and came back to win its second consecutive championship in 1993. Davis' Roadrunners would win back-to-back national championships again in 1999 and 2000.

Applying his coaching abilities beyond the Garden State, Davis led the NJCAA national team as an assistant in 1997 and head coach in 1999 when the squad defeated Team Canada.

Following his fourth national championship campaign at Rowan Gloucester, Davis moved on to coach then NAIA program Georgia Southwestern State. He compiled a 137-87 record in four seasons with the Canes, claiming the Georgia-Alabama-Carolinas Conference regular season crown and ranking fifth in the final NAIA poll in 2002.

In 2005, Davis made the step up to the NCAA DI level to take over the reins at Rider. Now in his 12th season with the Broncs, Davis has accumulated 291 wins – including a program-best 36 victories during the 2011 campaign. Rider won Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) regular season titles in 2013 and 2015 and claimed postseason tournament crowns in 2008 and 2010 for berths in the NCAA Baseball Tournament.

Davis currently serves as chairman of the MAAC Head Coaches Committee and member of the MAAC Baseball Championship Committee. He also has been a voter in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches Top 25 Poll since 2012.

Prior to his professional career, Davis played shortstop for four seasons at Bridgewater College – an NCAA DIII program in Virginia. As a junior in 1986, he was named team MVP and received first team All-Old Dominion Athletic Conference accolades.



Steve Burleson
Coach – Kansas City Kansas

In an illustrious 36-year career as head coach at Kansas City Kansas, Steve Burleson established himself as one of the top coaches in the history of two-year college athletics. Compiling a record of 1,102-672 with the Blue Devils, Burleson ended his career ranking 13th all-time in victories in the NJCAA.

Taking over the helm in 1980, Burleson became the program's fourth head coach since its establishment in 1975. During his tenure, the Blue Devils posted a .614 winning percentage and averaged over 30 wins per season. Kansas City Kansas won seven Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference (KJCCC) regular season titles, including a stretch of three consecutive championships from 1985-87.

Under Burleson's guidance, numerous student-athletes have gone on to enjoy great success both professionally and academically. Over the course of his career, Burleson saw 88 percent of his players receive scholarships to continue their education at four-year colleges. Former players David Segui and Kevin Young combined for 27 years playing in MLB. Segui enjoyed a 15-year career with the Baltimore Orioles, New York Mets, Montreal Expos and Seattle Mariners, while Young spent 12 years with the Pittsburgh Pirates and Kansas City Royals.

Outside of his success at Kansas City Kansas, Burleson's service to NJCAA baseball was invaluable. He spent time as vice president of the NJCAA Baseball Coaches Association and chairman of the NJCAA Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. In 1991, he managed the NJCAA national team that placed fourth in the Tournament of Americas held in Cuba.

Back in the Sunflower State, Burleson was instrumental in the writing of the KJCCC constitution. In 2012, he became the first active coach in Blue Devils history to be inducted into Kansas City Kansas Sports Hall of Fame. Burleson retired following the 2015 season.



Doug Little
Coach – Potomac State (WV)

In two stints as head coach of Potomac State, Doug Little has proven to be an invaluable asset to the Catamounts program. Boasting a 615-257 record entering his 19th season in Keyser, Little is seeking his seventh national tournament appearance.

Upon his arrival in 1993, Potomac State immediately began to experience success under the direction of Little. The Catamounts posted a 30-13 record in his first season and made the program’s first postseason appearance with a spot in the NJCAA DII Baseball World Series. Little guided the Catamounts back to the national tournament in 1994 where they placed second, finishing with a 30-6 overall record.

Moving to the NCAA in 1995, Little accepted an assistant position at West Virginia where he would spend the next five seasons. The Mountaineers benefited greatly from Little’s coaching and recruiting talents, posting three consecutive 30-win seasons and claiming back-to-back Big East Conference divisional crowns in 1996 and 1997.

Little returning to Potomac State in 2000 to be reinstated as head baseball coach with the additional responsibility as athletic director – a position he stepped away from in 2004. Despite a move to the NJCAA DI level, the Catamounts picked up right where they left off under Little’s tutelage. They recorded four straight 30-win seasons before earning the program’s first trip to the NJCAA DI Baseball World Series in 2004 – the first of three consecutive appearances at the national tournament. Potomac State qualified for its fourth NJCAA DI World Series in 2011.

Coaching a number of student-athletes recognized on the national level, Little’s products have proven to be among the best in the country. The success of Little’s players culminated in 2015 when Catamounts sophomore Evan Mitchell was named the Spalding® NJCAA DI Pitcher of the Year.

Following his high school graduation in 1984, Little played outfield at Alderson Broaddus – a former NAIA program – where he’d earn All-West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honors in two seasons. Little would go on to earn his bachelor’s degree from Alderson Broaddus and master’s degrees from Eastern Kentucky University and West Virginia Wesleyan University.

JUCO Mourns the Loss of Hall of Famer, Tim Hill



Tim Hill, the longtime coach at the State College of Florida (formerly Manatee Community College) passed away in December 2015 at the age of 71.

Hill's career coaching record during his 31 year career was 1,109-484 (.696 winning percentage). In 2009, his team defeated the Pittsburgh Pirates in a charity game that featured Andrew McCutchen while he was playing Triple-A ball. His team also defeated the Baltimore Orioles in a modified scrimmage during his final coaching season in 2012.

Tim Hill was inducted into the National Junior College Athletic Association Baseball Hall of Fame in 2005. Hill guided the State College of Florida to five NJCAA World Series appearances, culminating in two national runner-up finishes. He coached countless players who earned scholarships to four-year colleges and ones that were drafted to play professional baseball.

Jason Dill from the Bradenton Herald reported that winning and losing weren't the most important things to Tim Hill. The long-lasting relationships that he built with his athletes away from the baseball diamond remained strong over the years. Those countless relationships with his players, past and present, will forever define his legacy as a coach, a friend, and a JUCO Hall of Famer.

The entire JUCO family extends our condolences to Ginny, Hill's wife of 48 years, and the entire Hill family.

Remembering an MVP



JUCO fans might remember 2010 as the year that Bryce Harper came to the tournament. Bryce had been projected to be the #1 overall draft pick in the Major League draft. The entire tournament was abuzz with excitement, autograph seekers, photographers, and national media. ... However, being the #1 draft pick does not always equate to being the tournament MVP.

The 2010 tournament saw Ivan Hartle crowned as the tournament MVP. Ivan played for Iowa Western Community College when they started their championship run winning the national title 3 times in 5 years. We reached out to Ivan to see how his collegiate career impacted his life and where his life's journey had taken him.

To backtrack just a bit, Ivan grew up in Vancouver, British Columbia. Although there are many talented Canadian baseball players, Canada is not exactly known for producing them. If you were to take a survey to determine the most popular sport in Canada, the most common response might be hockey. But Ivan and his two older brothers shared a love of baseball. Family vacations around British Columbia often involved packing their baseball gear and finding a park to play in! All those vacation days playing baseball in a park paid off when Ivan was selected to play for the Canadian Junior National Baseball Team in 2008. That experience led to his opportunity to pursue his college education and play baseball at Iowa Western for Coach Marc Rardin. Iowa Western's success allowed Ivan to make the trip to Grand Junction in both of his junior college seasons. During the 2009 tournament, Iowa Western was eliminated after two games. When the Reivers returned in 2010, the team's hard work paid off.

When Ivan and his teammates arrived, they were playing with confidence and reaching for the stars. Iowa Western went the distance and finished the 2010 tournament as national champions. Ivan and his Reiver teammates had reached the pinnacle of their young lives. Occasionally, tournament MVP's do not always come from the championship team. However, Ivan's contributions were hard to overlook. His defensive play throughout the tournament was flawless. His contributions at the plate provided some of his best tournament memories when he hit three lead-off home runs (which led the tournament) and Ivan was on base to score the go-ahead run in the national championship game.

When Ivan was asked what he remembers about Grand Junction he will tell you he has many emotions. He remembers his freshman year when Coach Rardin told the team that coming to Grand Junction is a once in a lifetime opportunity. He will also forever remember the exact moment when Iowa Western won the national championship as one of the greatest moments of his young life. He will humbly tell you being selected as the tournament MVP was a huge honor and then deflects back to the success of his team.

Ivan went on to play Division 1 baseball at Western Kentucky University where he finished his collegiate baseball career. A major league draft was not to be, but fortunately he had carefully prepared himself if he couldn't realize a baseball career. Ivan's educational work led to his achieving a master's degree in teaching. Today, he continues to be an MVP in an oftentimes underappreciated field as a high school teacher in Vancouver. As a teacher, Ivan shares the lessons he has taken from baseball - to prepare and be confident, not just for class, but for life.

As for our current and future JUCO players, Ivan offers this, "Enjoy every second of the tournament. Take the time to look around and take it all in. It really is a once in a lifetime opportunity. You never know how long your baseball career will last, but I guarantee that no matter how far you got, Grand Junction and the JUCO World Series will be very high, if not the highest, on your list of accomplishments and experiences in baseball."

While Ivan has moved on to a professional career, he can attest that his 4-year playing career was an unforgettable time in his life. He also said, "Everything about baseball prepares you for life in general. I learned so many things from the game and almost all of them translate in to everyday life."

Today, when his is not teaching, Ivan spends his fun time teaching baseball in Vancouver and, being a true Canadian, he actually plays hockey in his spare time!

On behalf of the NJCAA Board of Directors and member colleges, I want to thank Commissioner Rob Manfred and his staff for their support of the NJCAA.”

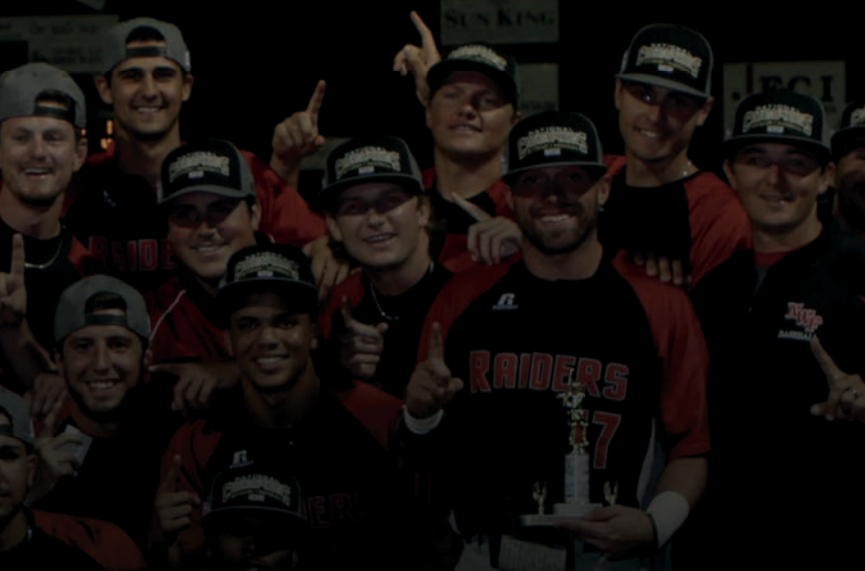
The 2015 tournament saw Iowa Western Community College return to Grand Junction to defend their national title. The Reivers were on their way to creating a JUCO dynasty winning 3 championships in 5 years. The Northwest Florida State Raiders were a new addition to the tournament while they embarked on their quest towards a national title.

Iowa Western started the year strong and on top of the national rankings. Northwest Florida State clearly didn't receive the respect in the national rankings until they received 1 point in the mid-April polls. Someone saw something stirring near the Florida coast. But just as fast as they appeared in the polls, they fell out of sight. When the final rankings came out in mid-May the Raiders were given enough credit to be ranked 14th going into the biggest tournament of their 2015 season – the Junior College World Series.

Making their first ever trip to Grand Junction, the Raiders drew the first game of the series. While fighting butterflies and after committing 4 errors, the Raiders came out of their introduction to the tournament with a 7-1 victory. They quickly put that game behind them and faced off against the defending national champions of Iowa Western. It was evident that the Reivers reputation was not going to carry much weight when Northwest Florida compiled 11 hits on their way to a 10-0 win to put the entire tournament on notice of their goal.

The Raiders quickly established that 10 was their lucky number and won their next 2 games by the score of 10-1 and 10-7. Their 4th game of the tournament saw the Raiders suffer their first loss of the tournament giving up 14 hits and committing 6 errors in a 5-1 loss to the McLennan College Highlanders.

Grand Junction - Supporting More than a Tragedy



Mid-February 2016 started out in a very difficult fashion with three Colorado law enforcement officers being killed in the line of duty within 3 weeks. Sometimes, we avoid losing one of our local heroes in the line of duty for years. Locally, the Mesa County Sheriff's Office had not experienced such a tragedy for 110 years until February 2016 when Deputy Derek Geer was killed as he confronted a young man with a gun. While the Geer family and their extended law enforcement family mourned the loss of a father, husband, and a friend, the local community provided a glimpse into what makes Grand Junction such a special place to live.

Almost immediately, people started to step forward to begin helping the Geer family during their most difficult time. Fundraising efforts provided assistance towards the immediate financial concerns in the first days that followed the heartbreaking event. Stickers that read #GEERSTRONG began to pop up all around town in car windows, business windows, or on homemade signs posted in yards along the streets. While supporting the Geer family became the catalyst, the community support extended towards the entire law enforcement community also increased. Events were held around town to place strips of blue tape across rear windows just like the black shroud on the officer's badges. This simple expression from the community not only supported the Geer family, it was a demonstration of support for our public safety professionals.

While the Geer family and friends felt the heartache of Derek's loss, the community responded to the call for help. Every year, many organizations throughout the Grand Valley extend their call for help to the community to support special projects. Organizations might need financial help, maybe they are looking for your blood type, or they might need your knowledge and skills to prepare tax forms for the elderly. Whatever the need might be, Grand Junction always seems to come through.

This also applies to JUCO. From time to time, we need people with specific skills to fill roles on our tournament committee. While our law enforcement officers in the valley are typically known for responding to crime related situations, the JUCO committee found several current and retired law enforcement officers that had some special skills that were necessary for us to effectively produce our nationally recognized tournament. As a result of our request for help, we currently have committee members from: the Colorado State Patrol, the Grand Junction Fire Department, the Grand Junction Police Department, the Mesa County Sheriff's Office, and the Mesa County District Attorney's Office. We have been fortunate to have had a long line of public safety members in the community serve on the tournament committee for many years. As a result of the skillful contributions from our public safety professionals, our committee has been able to grow stronger and the quality of our product of producing the JUCO tournament has improved.

While Derek's career of public service was cut short, he did not stop giving when he died. Derek responded to the cry for help as an organ donor saving some lives and improving the quality of life for many more. We should always respect and honor all of our public safety officers not because of how they may die, but because of how they have shared their lives making our community a better place to live.

We would like to thank all of our law enforcement and firefighting professionals for their service to our communities and to JUCO.

Grand Junction Challenger Baseball – World Series Bound

The great Lou Gehrig once said, “There is no room in baseball for discrimination. It is our national pastime and a game for all.” At the time, Gehrig was responding to segregation in baseball. Today, this quote has meaning beyond what he originally intended. Challenger Baseball started in Grand Junction 17 years ago and has grown to 8 teams.

Locally, JUCO and Challenger Baseball have been linked by a common goal, to create some special memories for all of the athletes and fans. Each year during the tournament, athletes from some of the collegiate programs take the time to play baseball with our challenger athletes. While both groups of athletes are playing a game they love, the biggest question is, “Just who is having the most fun?”

Over the years, our JUCO tournament has been recognized as one of the top sporting events in the country. The same can be said about our Challenger Baseball program. On August 27, 2016, our Grand Junction Challenger team will showcase their love of baseball by playing a nationally televised exhibition game at the home of the Little League World Series in Williamsport, Pennsylvania. It “seams” a little flat

The rules of baseball have not drastically changed since it unofficially became America’s favorite pastime. The majority of the changes made have probably been generated to make the game more competitive or adjustments to improve on safety for the athletes. From little league through the professional ranks, safety is the highest priority when considering any changes.

For example, when the aluminum bat was introduced, there was tremendous excitement that the games would increase offense which would, in turn, generate more excitement for the fans. While there was plenty of enthusiasm from the fans (baseball games were producing football scores), the safety of the players became a large concern because the ball was being hit at a speed that the defensive player was not able to respond to fast enough and the game became unsafe for the players, especially at youth levels. To return the game to a safer level of play, new bat manufacturing specifications were put in place that made the bat respond more like a wooden bat. While the game was safer, scoring again went down, the fans were disappointed, and some of the thrill of the game was absent again.

The NCAA recognized the problem during the 2013 NCAA Division 1 College World Series when there were only 3 home runs hit during the entire series. On behalf of the NCAA, Washington State University (WSU) Sport Science Laboratory began to study the baseballs being used. The research determined that a flat-seam baseball would travel farther than a raised-seam baseball.

There are many variables that can impact the actual distance a baseball can travel. However, in the controlled study by Washington State University, the flat-seam baseball traveled an average of 20 feet more than the raised-seam baseball. This minimal reduction in the wind drag on the baseball increased the distance the ball traveled without compromising the health and safety of the players.

To help you understand a little better, the seam on a flat-seam baseball is not entirely flat. The actual difference is minimal from a numbers perspective. The old collegiate baseball had stitching that was raised .048 inches. The baseball that was used by the NCAA Division 1 baseball program during the 2015 season had a seam height of .031 inches. After changing to the new flat-seam baseball, Division 1 baseball saw the 2015 season produce 44% more home runs than the 2014 season. Runs per game also went up 7%. Clearly the offensive production was on the upswing. What might not have been considered was the impact that the flat seam had on the pitching game. At the end of the 2015 season, pitchers recorded more than an 8% increase in strikeouts than before.

As far as pitching, the flat-seam baseball will allow a little more velocity on a fast ball, but pitchers may have a more difficult time throwing breaking balls. Because the flat-seam baseball is consistent with the ball used in the minor leagues and at the Division 1 level, it will help prepare the JUCO pitcher for their next level of play. Should they progress on to the major leagues, the seam at that level is even flatter.

The News and Observer newspaper in Raleigh, North Carolina, reported that North Carolina catcher Korey Dunbar said the flattened seams may actually have a positive effect on breaking ball pitchers and “... on off-speed pitches and even some fastballs,” the ball has a tighter break. He additionally said, “You have more of a tighter spin, so you have more late movement. It helps the pitcher out a little bit. But, on the other hand, you don’t have as much movement so it helps the hitter out.”

Throughout the 2016 season, several JUCO conferences used the flat-seam baseball during their regular season. Other conferences were allowed to wait until their current baseball supply contract ends before making the change. While each conference was allowed to choose which ball to use during the regular season, for our 59th Annual JUCO Tournament, the flat-seam baseball will be used.

As JUCO fans, we might be witnessing some new tournament records. Because home runs increased at the Division 1 level using the flat-seam baseball, it could be argued that we have a chance to see some new offensive records during the 2016 tournament. But wait, if strikeouts increased at the Division 1 level, maybe we will see some new pitching records. Or, because we play our JUCO tournament at altitude (compared to the study), the ball will travel an additional 7% farther than at sea level. Or, will we see pitchers with more movement on the pitch frustrate batters.

I guess there is always something to argue about when you are a baseball fan. Whether we think we are right or not, Yogi Berra said it best, “When it comes to baseball, you don’t know nothing!”

History Remembered

As we all enjoy tournament play for our 59th annual tournament, let’s take a walk down memory lane. 1959 was the first year the Junior College World Series appeared in Grand Junction. The tournament had eight teams representing seven states. Nobody traveled farther than the Wilmington Junior College Seahawks who made the trek from North Carolina on a bus. Just to remind you, air conditioning in motorized vehicles was relatively new in the 50’s. Even with today’s faster speeds, that is still more than 32 hours of drive time. However, the several days on the bus didn’t seem to impact Billy DeBruhl. As a young man, Billy made his only appearance at JUCO one for the record books.

Athletes at all levels have always made the claim that records are meant to be broken. In Billy’s case, that will never happen. Billy’s performance in the 1959 World Series cemented his place in the JUCO record books. He will never be replaced. Someday, someone might join him, but they cannot replace him. DeBruhl is the only pitcher in JUCO World Series history to pitch a no hitter! When asked if he was aware that he still holds that distinction, you could almost hear the smile as he said, “Yes, people have told me about that.”

Billy went on to play baseball 2 more years at South Carolina before stepping off the playing field. He stayed involved in baseball coaching teams of all levels for many years around his home town of Camden, SC. When asked what advice he would give to our current players, he paused for a moment and just said, “Play Ball! That’s what they are there to do.” Couldn’t have said it better myself.

Congratulations Billy DeBruhl! Your performance remains an achievement that may never be equaled.



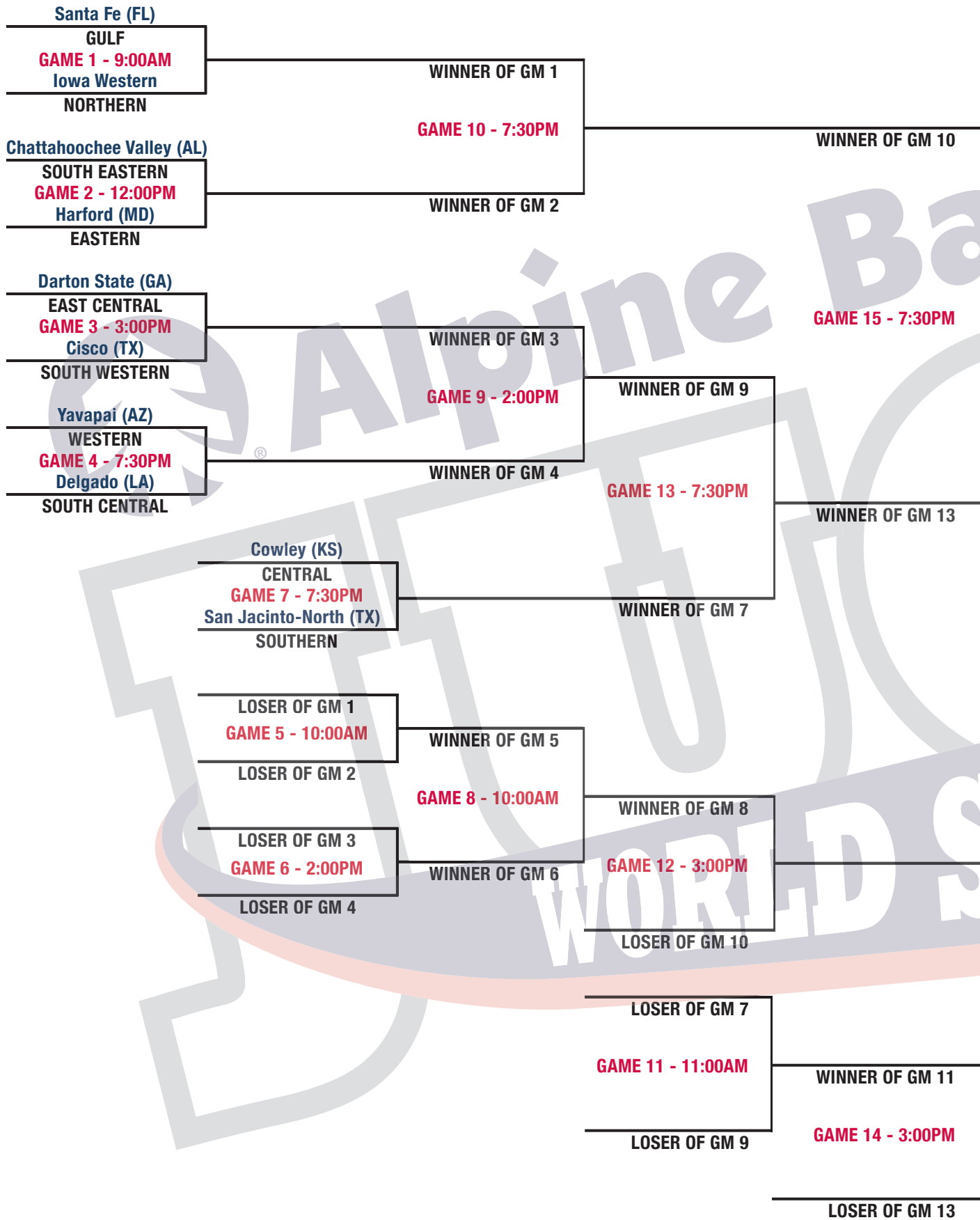
